Travel Vaccinations are Changing at Chew

If you are planning on travelling, you may need some vaccinations or medication. Patients travelling abroad should take some time to consider any potential risks in the areas being visited and ensure to allow enough time before travelling (a minimum of 8 weeks)

Some vaccines may need more than one dose.

Chew Medical Practice does not provide a full travel clinic service. However, we do provide the agreed NHS vaccinations.

Patients are responsible for checking their own vaccine history and can find this using their NHS App or via patient online services. If you do not have access to a smartphone, you can download a copy from our website, failing that you can collect a hard copy of the form and leaflet from reception.

For these free vaccines please contact our reception team who will send you a link to complete a Pre-Travel Questionnaire.

When the forms are returned, they are reviewed by our Nursing team, and a text message confirming what vaccines are required will be sent asking you to call and book an appointment

If your travel scenario is complicated, such as back packing, long term aid working or travelling through several different countries, you will need to book a consultation at *a private travel health clinic* as there may be chargeable travel vaccines.

Bra Recycling It's time to bin your bra! breast cancer



The bra recycling scheme takes your unwanted or unloved bras and through our network of bra banks raises vital funds for pioneering breast cancer research.

(Our Bra Bank is located to the left of the reception desk next to the information table)

Together with our recycling partners, our textile recovery project prevents these bras going into landfill before giving them a new lease of life.

Successful ventures like this provide employment and an income for people living in the UK.

Any bras that are genuinely beyond redemption are dismantled and disposed of properly.

For every tonne of bras collected, Against Breast Cancer receives £700 to fund our research.

With over 30 million women in the UK, you could really help make a difference!

This will make sure you are invited for a lung health check in the future.

Why lung health checks are done!

Lung cancer causes more deaths than any other cancer in the UK. There are often no signs or symptoms of lung cancer at an early stage.

The targeted Lung Health Check programme aims to find lung cancer early, sometimes before you have symptoms.

Lung health checks look at how well your lungs are working and can help diagnose lung cancer as early as possible.

Early diagnosis can make lung cancer more treatable and make treatment more successful.
