Travel Advice

If you are planning on travelling you may need some vaccinations or medication.

Travelling is one of life's great pleasures, but it's important to remember that there is no such thing as risk free travel. Patients travelling abroad should take some time to consider any potential risks in the areas being visited.

Chew Medical Practice do not provide a full travel clinic service. However, we do provide the agreed NHS (free) vaccinations, listed below:

Hep A & Hep B for Children Combined
Hep A
Hep A & Typhoid Combined
Polio, Diphtheria & Tetanus
Hep A&B Combined
Typhoid injection or oral
Cholera—This would need to be ordered

For these free vaccines, please complete a 'Travel Risk Assessment form' and check your vaccine history using the NHS App or via Patient online services, then make an appointment to see a Practice Nurse.

Please remember to leave enough time before travelling (minimum of 8 weeks) as some vaccines might need more than one dose and can take time to complete the course.

If you need further advice or non NHS vaccines you will need to book an appointment with one of the private travel clinics for a consultation to complete a full risk assessment and private vaccines.
