From October 2025 the following people will be eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine:

- residents in a care home for older adults
- all adults aged 75 years and over
- persons aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed

ON MONDAY 1 SEPTEMBER 2025 PREGNANT WOMEN AND ALL ELIGIBLE CHILDREN CAN START TO HAVE THEIR FLU VACCINATION.




